The California Dental Association Foundation improves the health of Californians by promoting total health, disease prevention, risk assessment, and treatment of health-related diseases through strategic partnerships with allied organizations.

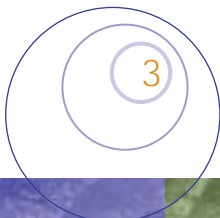
The CDA Foundation's Purpose

- To improve the health of Californians by linking the dental profession to community needs.
- To promote the concept that oral health and general health are inseparable, as oral health is critical to the total health and well-being of an individual.
- To promote total health, educate the public about disease prevention and risk assessment, and treat oral health-related diseases.
- To be the leading facilitator of oral health policy resulting in reduced oral disease and related health concerns.
- To provide grant opportunities to community-based organizations and individuals to reduce disparities in access to oral health care and assist in meeting the immediate needs of people in underserved communities.
- To promote and support a dynamic oral health workforce capable of meeting the oral health needs of Californians.
- To represent the philanthropic values of the dental profession.

Scholarships, Endowments and Grants

Second-Year Scholarship Program

The CDA Foundation awarded \$30,000 in grants to five California dental schools in 2004 to support dental student education. The grant funds directly benefited a total of 32 second-year dental students. Scholarship applicants are evaluated based on financial need, community leadership, and academic achievement.





Allied Dental Student Scholarship Program

Through enhanced funding of the Allied Dental Student Scholarship Program, the CDA Foundation awarded over \$32,000 in grants to component dental societies to help stimulate allied dental personnel recruitment and retention efforts. The Allied Dental Student Scholarship is available to hygienist, dental assistant or dental laboratory technician students who apply through the local component dental society. In 2004, 24 local societies presented checks and certificates from the CDA Foundation to 83 university, community college and regional occupational program students.

Dr. Arthur A. Dugoni Faculty Endowment

In August 2004, the CDA Foundation established the Dr. Arthur A. Dugoni Faculty Endowment. The CDA Board of Trustees contributed the inaugural \$105,000 to commemorate Dr. Dugoni's remarkable accomplishments and contributions to



California dental education and organized dentistry. Additionally, the Board felt this legacy was an appropriate way to recognize the special honor he received in having the University of the Pacific Dental School named after him.

This faculty recruitment and development program supports dental programs affiliated with the five California dental schools, and establishes criteria for awarding scholarships to dental personnel and other scientists seeking to fill faculty positions. The first scholarship is anticipated to be awarded in 2005.

Healthy Californians Grant Program

The Healthy Californians Grant Program is awarded to community clinics and nonprofit organizations that address one of three areas: access to care, education/prevention, or direct restorative treatment. In December 2004, the CDA Foundation presented the Open Door Community Health Centers and QueensCare Family Clinics with a \$25,000 grant award for their mobile dental service programs and outstanding efforts to support treatment services for underserved communities.

Dental Hygiene Education Grant Program

Riverside Community College Foundation was selected as the recipient of a \$25,000 grant for its new dental hygiene education program. The program has been supported by the Tri-County Dental Society since its inception, and was the driving force for Riverside Community College to design, develop and implement the program that endeavors to graduate 18 dental hygienists each year. The Foundation's hygiene education grant program has now provided seed funding for three dental hygiene education programs throughout California.





Relief Fund

The CDA Foundation continues to administer aid to dentists and their families in times of need due to accident, natural disaster or death. In 2004, a total of four renewal applications were reviewed and approved by the grant selection committee, providing over \$19,500 of aid. This amount was matched, dollar for dollar, by the American Dental Association Foundation.

The Foundation works ardently to develop additional resources for this invaluable assistance program. This past year, California dentists reached out to colleagues in Florida through financial contributions to assist dentists whose practice and lives were affected by the series of devastating hurricanes.

California and Nevada Dental Practice-Based Research Network

To assist general dental practitioners in the routine care of their patients, the CDA Foundation took a lead role in developing a multi-state collaborative proposal to establish the first dental practitioner-based research network (PBRN) in California and Nevada. The Foundation will work with public agencies and philanthropic organizations to develop and implement this innovative research initiative. If successful, the PBRN for California and Nevada will enlist at least 350 dental practices to represent general dentistry and dental hygiene from a variety of cultural, ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds, and participate in multiple Phase III clinical trials and prospective observational studies.

Improving Access to Oral Health Care

Pediatric Oral Health Access Program (POHAP)

Designed to increase access to restorative dental care for children, particularly the underserved, POHAP has successfully empowered general dentists with the necessary skills to expand their practices to include children under age 5 and children with special needs (physical and developmental disabilities). This past year, the program received continuation funding from L.A. Care Health Plan to repeat the comprehensive pediatric dentistry restorative training program for 50 general practice dentists throughout Los Angeles County. At the completion of the no-cost training program, each participating dentist agrees to regularly treat young children in their practice and to provide free dental care to at least 18 underserved children. In 2004, 1,300 new patients were touched by the program, 327 kids received free treatment, and over 6,000 procedures were performed.

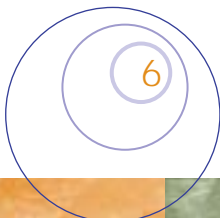


Caring for the Underserved

Sharing a commitment to improving access to care for diverse and underserved populations, particularly children, the CDA Foundation was pleased to continue its successful partnership with Sullivan-Schein Dental. Through this unique public-private partnership, the CDA Foundation was able to leverage the company's global corporate citizenship grant program – *Henry Schein Cares* – to again award a record number of non-profit California dental clinics and organizations with donated equipment and supplies.

Fifteen organizations submitted proposals to receive the coveted two-year grants. Ten non-profit organizations and clinics were recipients this year, including:

Dental Health Begins at Birth

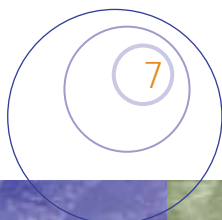
Acting as the lead agency in a joint venture agreement with the Dental Health Foundation, the CDA Foundation signed a 4-year, \$7 million contract with First 5 California in February 2004. Said to be one of the largest oral health grants, it will fund the First 5 *First Smiles* education and training project emphasizing the detection and prevention of Early Childhood Caries (ECC).

ECC is the most prevalent chronic childhood disease in California – and is also the most preventable. Approximately 40 percent of children enter kindergarten having had caries. First 5 California – formerly the California Children and Families Commission – is the result of the 1998 Proposition 10 ballot initiative which imposed a \$0.50 per package tax on all tobacco products. The goal of First 5 is to create programs for all California children, prenatal to 5 years of age, including children with disabilities and other special needs, to ensure they get off to the right start and enter school healthy and ready to learn.

The First 5 *First Smiles* program is charged with educating dental and medical professionals throughout the state on the prevention and detection of early childhood caries, and providing resources and educational materials to families with young children. The CDA Foundation has led the development of the *First Smiles* curriculum and training materials kit, and coordinates live trainings, peer-reviewed articles in the *Journal of the California Dental Association* and web-based distance learning using the latest scientific information on dental disease prevention in children.

The joint venture has established a large and extensive network of partners including California dental schools, local dental societies and the California Primary Care Association to perform training activities. A significant parent education component also complements the curriculum through a partnership with WIC, Head Start, California Childhood Health Linkages and First 5 School Readiness programs to train early childhood educators working directly with parents in these settings. Messages to the parents will reinforce what the dental and medical professionals are being trained on, to deliver a unified message statewide.

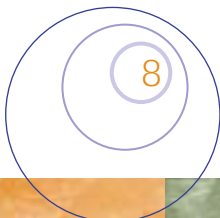
First Smiles is geared toward three audiences:

- Dental professionals
 - Non-specialty dentists
 - Hygienists
 - Dental assistants
 - Dental students
- Medical professionals
 - Pediatricians
 - Family practice physicians
 - OB/GYNs
 - Nurse practitioners
 - Medical residents
- Parents, caregivers and the general community
 - Educated through programs conducted by early childhood educators including WIC, Head Start, First 5 School Readiness and California Childhood Health programs

In addition, a Scientific Advisory Committee was assembled, comprised of members from academia, private practice, public health, community clinics, pediatrics and family practice. These experts volunteered countless hours to the *First Smiles* project to lend their expertise, experience and passion to improve the health of California's children.

The CDA Foundation is also proud of its involvement with the Caries Management By Risk Assessment (CAMBRA) workgroup. Comprised of representatives from the five California dental schools, as well as schools in Oregon, Washington and Arizona, the workgroup strives to incorporate risk assessment and preventative medicine into dental school curricula, providing sustainability of these concepts through pre-service training.

A user-friendly online clearinghouse has been developed for the First 5 *First Smiles* program to house scientific articles, anticipatory guidance references, risk assessment forms, videos and training calendars. The site will also offer the professional curriculum on-demand for participants who are unable to attend a live training. Community Outreach

Dental Professionals Against Violence (DPAV)

Statistics show that 65 percent of physical child abuse is visible in the head and neck region. Approximately 75 percent of physical injuries from domestic violence are inflicted to the head, face, mouth and neck. Through a partnership with the Blue Shield of California Foundation and Dental Benefit Providers, the DPAV training program has begun to spawn a systemic change in how dental professionals view their role and responsibility in the fight against violence and neglect. In March 2004, the Blue Shield of California Foundation and Dental Benefit Providers of California renewed their commitment to the importance of the program. Since inception of this grant renewal, over 650 dental providers and their staff were educated on how to recognize and respond to injuries that are caused by all forms of family violence and abuse. In October 2004, DPAV was awarded the Family Violence Prevention Fund's Professional Health Organization Leadership Award at the National Conference on Health Care and Domestic Violence in Boston, Massachusetts.

Health Policy Research

Allied Dental Workforce Study

Two years ago, 14,000 surveys were distributed to licensed, practicing dentists seeking information on the trends, recruitment and retention of dental hygienists and assistants. This past year, the Allied Dental Workforce Study concluded the two-year partnership between the CDA Foundation and the UCLA Center for Health Policy Research. The resulting final report, available in 2005, provides technical findings useful to the development of future policies and solutions to recruitment, retention and educational training programs for licensed or registered allied dental health personnel in the state. The careful examination of these challenges within the allied dental health personnel workforce responds to the ongoing impact this shortage has on the delivery of dental care in California. Community Health

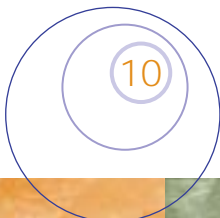
Community Water Fluoridation

As a key partner and fiscal intermediary of the California Fluoridation Work Group 2010, the CDA Foundation continued to make progress in key battle-ground communities. The City of Escondido and the Helix Water District made significant steps forward after years of intense negotiation. Fluoridated water began flowing in Escondido in September 2004, and the Helix Water District finally agreed with CDA's grant funding agreement and has advanced their planning and design phase. Another highlight came when SB96 – a bill supported by the CDA – was signed into law by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger. This legislative victory effectively closed many of the anti-fluoridation loopholes found in the original statute (AB733).

Additionally, both the CDA and the CDA Foundation were instrumental this past year in helping to defeat the *Watsonville vs. California Department of Health Services* lawsuit regarding a discrepancy between state fluoridation laws and a recently passed local ordinance. This landmark case continues to demonstrate the importance of community water fluoridation as a matter of statewide concern.

Media Outreach

The CDA Foundation was the co-contributing editor for the April and May 2004 editions of the *Journal of the California Dental Association*. These two issues of the *Journal* were dedicated to family violence prevention. The April issue focused on child abuse/neglect and elder and dependent adult abuse/neglect, and the May issue centered on domestic and intimate partner violence and violence against people with special needs. The CDA Foundation executive director partnered with Dr. Kathleen Shanel-Hogan, chief consultant for the Dental Professionals Against Violence (DPAV) program, and Marianne Balin, MPH, from the Blue Shield of California Foundation to produce this series. These two *Journal* editions spawned an immediate response and interest in family violence awareness and prevention from the professional dental community as advocated by the DPAV program.



Fundraising

The CDA Foundation is committed to creating a robust fundraising program. The 2004 annual fund drive direct mail was a huge success – with the average gift size increasing by 50 percent, participation growing by 30 percent and the total income doubling. In addition to the success of the fund drive, two appeals were included in the *CDA Update* to enlist support for a newly created endowment fund and to assist with disaster relief efforts in Florida. The CDA Foundation also coordinated a special fundraising event at the House of Delegates President's Dinner Dance and hosted a second event in conjunction with the Dental Forum where guests learned about the CDA Foundation and how to contribute through a Foundation gift club.

The CDA Foundation was also incredibly proud to introduce two new fundraising events in 2004. A silent auction was featured at the Spring Scientific Sessions in Anaheim, where over 130 items were available for bidding, raising \$22,700. At the Fall Scientific Sessions in San Francisco, the CDA Foundation hosted *Miles for Smiles*, a 5K run/2.5K walk along San Francisco's pristine Presidio. These newly established events are intended to raise awareness for the CDA Foundation while offering higher profile sponsorship opportunities for corporate supporters.

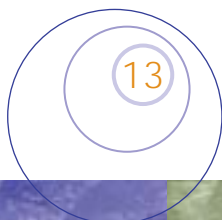
